Cry of the Earth

- metal smelting, coal-burning utilities, and vehicle emissions impacting agricultural and forest productivity
- air pollution and resulting acid rain severely affecting lakes and damaging forests
- ocean waters becoming contaminated due to agricultural, industrial, mining, and forestry activities (press release for climate action)

Cry of the Poor

- the rights of Indigenous peoples, including violations of their right to safe drinking water and police mistreatment and abuse of Indigenous women and girls
- Canada also grapples with serious human rights issues relating to the placement of children in immigration detention, and the use of prolonged solitary confinement (Working with migration)

English-speaking Canada

- 1) We will collaborate with the French-speaking Canadian constellation to do a joint Press release in September, at the time of the UN Summit on Climate Action - in advance of our federal election. We will state our commitment to care of the Earth and invite voters to ask candidates about their policies.
 - 2) We will make contact with students organizers of the Friday for the Future and invite them to a Zoom call at our November constellation meeting.

- 1) We commit ourselves to environmental care by reducing the waste on our streets, creating awareness of it in all our schools through pupils and parents. We shall lobby through senators or MPs to get rid of plastics. We shall invite religious to stop the use of plastics in all its forms. We shall create awareness for the use of shopping bags instead of plastics among ourselves and to others through shopping centers.
