#### Cry of the Earth

- Urban growth is reducing biodiversity
- Modern farming methods are causing water pollution
- Urban pollution is very bad
- Commercial fishing is affecting health of surrounding marine areas
- New Zealand has high greenhouse gas emissions per person
- Invasive animal and plant species are adversely affecting native wildlife and ecosystems

#### Cry of the Poor

- High poverty rates affecting children and families
- Inadequate housing for lower income people
- High incarceration rate, indigenous Māori comprise 16% of the population but 57% of adults sentenced to prison
- Affordable housing crisis

CONFERENCE FOR MAJOR SUPERIORS IN THE PACIFIC ISLANDS STATEMENT on the CLIMATE CRISIS (2019)

CREATIONS CRY

Climate change is strangling creation. The thresholds to ensure the balance of our ecosystem have been surpassed. Some islands have already disappeared and by the middle of this century more of our island nations we call home will have been lost. We are drowning. Alarming evidence shows that our oceans are warming, our sea levels rising, our lands eroding, our water is becoming undrinkable and our fish dying. Our people are crying out one with our islands, sea and air – “ENOUGH!” We are clinging to our way of life only by the thread of possible change by the rich and powerful, and, our own awareness of creation’s cry. Our islands will be no more and our children, homeless, our future forsaken!

Inspired by the Gospels, driven by Laudato Si, and recognizing the urgency of the Climate Crisis facing us, we the CMSPI affirm the following and are called to action. We consider it an imperative that awareness and an ecological conversion take hold throughout the Pacific and the world through the following strategies:

- We encourage our religious leaders to ensure our schools include an ecological component to their curriculum; that likewise all our parishes and

- We recognize the need to use social media to create awareness of the crisis.
- We call on the powerful nations to heed our cry and enact policies and laws that ensure limited and acceptable CO2 and other greenhouse gas emissions
- We support our respective governments in their endeavor to change islands policies and laws to a more simple way of life, learning from our ancestors and past practices conducive to natural harmonious existence. This includes refraining from using harmful, ecologically unfriendly products (Styrofoam, plastics, etc.) from abroad.
- We challenge the capital/profit driven ventures that have no concern for ecology, for example seabed mining. We call on governments to ensure strict codes of conduct to ensure ecological preservation.
- We promote collaboration with other Religions, NGOs and our respective governments to respond to the Climate Crisis.

Cry of the Poor

- Violence against women is common
- Women do not have fully equal rights. Women can lease, but not own land.
